Ontario Institutes New Blue Box Funding Obligations

While the blue box is well known across Ontario, some recent changes to industry's participation may not be.

Ontario's Waste Diversion Act that passed in June 2002 will require all companies introducing packaging and printed paper into the Ontario consumer marketplace to share in the funding of 50% of Ontario's municipal blue box waste diversion programs. The earliest possible date of obligation was expected to begin June 1, 2003.

When the new law comes into effect, Stewardship Ontario will begin to register the estimated 5,000-10,000 obligated brand owners and first importer companies doing business in Ontario. Fees will be set for each company, funds collected and payments sent out to Ontario's municipalities.

In December of last year, Health Canada released the much anticipated Gazette II version of its mandatory nutritional labelling regulations.
